The Berean Sunday School Class, led by Tom Shelton, has been in the book of Jude going verse by verse and it has proven to be quite a study. As a pastor, I cannot describe how refreshing it is to see up to 15 men going deep in God's Word. We are living in a time where men are seen as toxic if they display any manliness, show any assertiveness in their God given roles, or dare to open the door for the weaker vessel. This class could actually be seen

as dangerous! Women be warned, there's a bunch of men in the basement of Calvary Baptist Church and they are not effeminate! Can't you just hear Archie and Edith singing, "Girls were girls and men were men." Yes, "those were the days," but what days are we in now? Whatever your take is on COVID, 19, 20, 21, 22 and be-

yond, as well as the war in Eastern Europe. Just about everyone has been taken aback by the insane and immoral agenda being normalized, and of all places Disneyland. What in the world is going on? God's people should be thankful that a mouse trap has been set to keep Disneyland from infiltrating little minds any further than they have already. Did this just happen? Did this darkness from hell just spring up from nowhere, maybe from Kansas and a strong wind blew it all the way to Florida? Everyone was tossed back and forth with the COVID madness, but when a company that is known for entertaining children, has made it their agenda to convince 3-year olds about fluid sexuality, it's time for the gloves to come off. This is far more dangerous than

COVID will ever be. Let that sink into your hearts and minds. For those who have children and grand-children, understand that this has the possibility of a pandemic of mutilation along with puberty blockers for children!

Christ." I want to draw your attention to "certain men have crept in unnoticed." If you have lived in East Tennessee for at least one year, you know what a stink bug is. They creep in unnoticed, unheard and before you know it they are flying and crawling all over the house. Jude warns of false teachers silently crawling in and amongst God's people. They are like a tic on a fat dog as they get dug in and have to be forcibly removed. Robertson Word Study says, "they sink or plunge, so to slip in secretly as if by a side door." When it comes to the culture, there is no doubt that someone left the gate wide open! But Jude, as well as Peter, speak directly to

the Church. How we have been astonished with how people crept in all the way up to be President of the SBC, and have advocated for Critical Race Theory, be a promoter of being soft on homosexuality and still keep their positions. There is a correction slowly taking place, but the bugs just keep coming. Before you get nervous and think there is no hope, keep in mind Jesus said that in the "Last Days" there would be an abundance of false teachers. We are not calling anyone to be harsh or mean, but look at it as if someone is trying to seduce your child and give them something that will harm them eternally. That should get anyone's blood boiling. Havner put it like this: "The early Christians condemned false doctrine in a way that sounds almost unchristian today." That's what has happened in Southern Baptist Life, we have become more nice than God and we have paid a horrific price for it. I am praying as the men continue to meet in the basement and speak with great boldness (wives not present) that we will continue to lead the church as God has appointed! But also, as we make our way into the 2nd Epistle of Peter as a congregation; may we be better equipped to stand more firm than we have ever stood. 2 Peter 2:1-3 says, "But there were also false prophets among the people, even as there will be false teachers among you, who will secretly bring in destructive heresies, even denying the Lord who bought them, and bring on themselves swift destruction. And many will follow their destructive ways, because of whom the way of truth will be blasphemed. By covetousness they will exploit you with deceptive words; for a long time their judgment has not been idle, and their destruction does not slumber." Let us be found standing firm on the promises of God's Word. We have our marching orders to give the Gospel to all. Giving the truth in God's love is the key to unlocking a fortress of selfishness. This is not about winning an argument, but winning a soul as the truth sets them free. Let us not be ashamed of the Gospel.

## A Word from Christain



Greetings!

It's time for another update from the student ministry.

We're still working our way through the doctrine of salva-

tion on Sunday mornings. We've talked about common grace and saving grace. We've talked about election and reprobation. We've also talked about union with Christ. Now we're studying regeneration, which you might also know as the new birth or being born again. It refers to the reception of spiritual life from God in place of the spiritual death that we are born with. While Jesus himself taught that regeneration was a mystery, there are still a number of truths the Scriptures reveal about it, and that's what we're currently studying.

We're still studying Proverbs on Sunday nights. We completed Chapter 20, and now we're working our way through Chapter 21. There are too many topics

to touch upon here, so I'll let you read it for your-selves!

We're still studying the Book of Colossians on Wednesday nights. We finished Chapters 1 and 2. Now we're working our way through Chapter 3. There are two major parts; crucial to both is the teaching that we are new creations in Christ, who have shared in Christ's death and resurrection as believers. Because of that, in the first part, there are sinful behaviors we must put off, and there are obedient behaviors that we must put on as Christians.

Now for the second part. Because of our new identities in Christ, there are expectations of Christian households: wives must submit to husbands; likewise, children must obey parents, and slaves must obey masters. Whereas, husbands must lead wives with love and without harshness, and fathers must likewise lead children without provoking them to discouragement. Here's what's important to recognize in this household code. Husbands must model

Christ's lordship, who is a wise ruler and who is gentle as the norm (there are occasions for harshness, which Christ's life illustrated). Wives, children, and slaves must model the church's submission to Christ, which should be holistic and happy obedience. Households that disobey this code misrepresent the Christ/church relationship. And households that disobey this code dishonor Christ and invite discipline into their lives, which usually takes on the form of chaos and misery. While pop culture, both secular and sacred, likes to criticize husbands and fathers for the breakdown of the household, as a pastor, I've seen that unsubmissive wives and disobedient children are equally common.

As for this month's events, if you haven't heard, the lockdowns, school closures, and other covid reactions have wreaked havoc on children and teens. Among those problems are increased numbers of anxiety, depression, self-mutilation, and suicides. Because of that, Summit Life and Tim Tebow are putting on a conference in Johnson City to address this crisis with a message of Christian hope. We'll be attending that conference as a youth event. We'll also be having an end of school year celebration at the end of May.
