It's time for another update from the student ministry. For our November event, we bought and boxed items for Operation Christ-

mas Child. For our December event, we'll go ice skating in Bristol.

On Sunday mornings, we're working our way through the doctrine of the church. We've talked about the nature of the church, the characteristics of a faithful church, the mission of the church, various ministries of the church, the officers of the church, and now the government of the church. It'll still be a few weeks yet before we finish.

On Sunday nights, we're still working our way through Romans. We're currently in Romans 8, which some have said is the greatest chapter in the New Testament. We've seen the sinfulness of the human heart, the inability of the human to save themselves through law, and the ability of the guilty to be forgiven through faith in Jesus.

On Wednesday nights, we're working our way through the first collection of the Psalms. We're currently in Psalm 11. We've seen God's faithfulness to his covenant and his covenant people, and we've seen how humans should respond to adversity, which includes trusting in God for deliverance and remaining obedient in the midst of persecution. I read a fascinating book that I'd recommend to you. It's called the Atheism of the Early Church by

Rushdoony. It's a quick and easy read. In the Roman empire, Christians were accused of atheism, incest,

and cannibalism. It's not just because Christians didn't worship the gods and goddesses common to Greco-Roman mythology. It's also because they didn't view Caesar as Lord. Instead, Christians outright said that Christ was Lord. Because of this obvious threat to Roman religion and politics (which always go hand in hand), Christians became severely persecuted. Faithful Christians are being targeted today for the same reasons. If we're faithful to the Scriptures, we're a threat to religion and politics in America (and across the world). That's why public enemy number 1 is "Christian nationalism." The word Christian threatens secularism, humanism, and paganism, as well as any other common religion. The word nationalism threatens anarchism, globalism, and imperialism. I don't know what the future holds, but I suspect it'll be more destruction before reformation. No matter what may come, keep the faith. Christ is Lord, and he'll conquer his enemies. The worst they can do is kill us, but even then, all they're doing is sending us to Christ and the saints in heaven. That's still a win for us.
