Although this is a spiritual battle, the difference between the two kingdoms are visible. The contrast between light and darkness is clearly seen by the moral stand people take for God, and for those who are on the side of the devil. As the country celebrates the 4th of Ju-

ly, let us remember that Christ has liberated us from the power of sin. The lives of people who now belong to God are clearly different from those who are still slaves to sin. However, the battle against the world, the flesh and the devil is very real. So if you have been ensnared by the enemy, follow the instruc-

tion of Scripture and get back in the battle. The armor that God has provided, is not a story for children to turn into a time to go to the playground, build castles and throw cotton balls at one another. The armor is to be rightly used to wage a real warfare as Paul says in Ephesians 6:12, "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places." God spoke to little lives as they gathered in the sanctuary to learn songs that had the theme of the armor. The children then went to class where they were taught the Bible and how to advance God's kingdom through missions.

God's love and truth (the Gospel) that is found in His Word, is His method of advancing His kingdom. The children collected quarters as they were taught, one meal cost a quarter. They raised \$928.27 for hunger relief in Nepal. The food will be given in Jesus name, to share His love in a tangible way as the Gospel will be given. As VBS came to a close, the children packed up and went to Fun in the Son Summer Camp. The children had a lot of fun, but most important, they got more Gospel teaching and training. Please be in prayer for all these precious children. Our desire is to see each of them come to faith in

Christ at the earliest age, and be well prepared and equipped to fight the good
fight of faith. Calvary is staying the course
in, "contending for the faith" and being as
practical as possible to fulfill our part of the
great commission. Calvary Cares continues to help in our own community. There is
a missions team from Calvary in Wisconsin

laboring away to help a sister church. The staff will once again be partnering with Anna Huggins and the Holston Baptist Association to teach children at the Baptist Center in Johnson City. And it was refreshing to see Bryan, Mary and the children in from their place of service with the IMB. Let us continue to look for open doors that God gives us, so others may know the truth and be liberated from the tyranny of sin and be "free indeed."

Greetings, Calvary family!

It's time for another update from the student ministry.

On Sunday mornings, we're working our way through the doctrine of the Christian life. We've begun with a study of

the spiritual disciplines of the Christian life. These are patterns of behavior for the purposes of obedience and growth in godliness. So far, we have talked about Bible intake, prayer, worship, service, stewardship, and fasting. My hope and prayer is that the students become consistent practitioners of these disciplines while they're young.

On Sunday evenings, we have completed our series on Romans, which is probably Paul's most famous letter. After this, we'll continue the Book of Hebrews, which I preached from not too long ago. By the end, my hope is that the students understand how Jesus fulfills the Old Testament and how Christianity is much superior to old covenant Judaism.

On Wednesday evenings, we have completed our series on the Psalms, which was very rewarding. And we have started a new series on the Minor Prophets (Hosea through Malachi). Instead of getting a detailed view of each book, which would probably take me years to do, I've decided to do a quicker overview of each prophet. We'll do this by reading each prophet in one sitting if we can. I've also decided to do this chronologically, so that they can see the narrative of Israel's decline and exile and Judah's decline and exile as we go. So far, we have studied Jonah and Amos. My hope is that students see how patient and gracious God is. At the same time, I hope they also see that disobeying God as a nation brings grave consequences.

In June, we got to enjoy together the free fishing day in Tennessee; I prayed for at least one fish, and I caught it. A number of the students got to help with VBS this year; I had a great time with the 4th-6th graders. We helped deliver furniture to the

Mission House for the Holston Baptist Association. And we got to help serve people through Calvary Cares.

In July, we might go see the Sound of Freedom movie starring Jim Caviezel on the week of July 4th. The plan is for the boys to enjoy a paintball trip while the girls enjoy a pottery trip on July 8th. We'll have a combined youth and Trail Life event with John Harris on July 14th, where he and his friend will teach us gun safety. We'll go to the Baptist Center the week of July 17th in order to teach kids about Christianity in the nearby apartments. And we might have a water event on July 29th.

This month's book recommendation is Gary North's Unholy Spirits, which is a study of paranormal and demonic activity. I haven't finished the book yet, but what I've read so far has been fascinating. Here are some examples. Did you know there have been numerous eyewitness accounts of spontaneous human combustion, even into the 20th century (when North wrote this book)? People caught on fire, didn't feel pain, and didn't burn their houses or furniture around them, but even jumping into a body of water couldn't stop the flames from spreading and killing them. Did you know that putting razor blades on a pyramid structure has caused the blades to never go dull? Did you know that putting dead remains in the Pharaoh's chamber has caused the remains not to decay for an abnormally long time? Again, I haven't finished the book, but it has been a fascinating read. North's main thesis is that civilizations see an increased amount of paranormal activity (which he interprets as demonic activity) and outright demonic activity before undergoing a collapse or massive change. If North's thesis is correct, then we may be headed in that direction ourselves, for we have seen an increase in outright Satanism in our country, and there are increased reports of the bizarre, including UFO sightings.

tival. Today we know this celebration as Pentecost. Jesus promised in Acts 1:8, power through the Holy Spirit to participate in this wheat harvest of souls. Believers should understand that the Spirit, Himself, is the firstfruits of every true believer's inheritance (Ephesians 1:14).

While the Holy Spirit is the down payment on our own personal salvation, He is also the agent to secure the full harvest of the wheat. However, we are the physical representation of the body of Christ. Ephesians 2:20, "We are His workmanship, created in Messiah Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them."
