Greetings, Calvary family!

It's time for another update from the student ministry.

On Sunday mornings, we're still working our way through the doctrine of the

Christian life. We finished our series on the spiritual disciplines. Now we're working on a series called the standards of godliness. The spiritual disciplines taught us how to grow. The standards of godliness teach us what we're supposed to grow in. So far, we've focused on humility, contentment, gratitude, and joy. It's been a convicting series. I'm really thankful for the opportunity to study it with the students.

On Sunday evenings, we're working our way through the Book of Hebrews. We've made it to Chapter 4, which overwhelmingly has two emphases: entering God's rest and not hardening ourselves against Jesus. The two themes are related. If we harden ourselves against Jesus, we'll never enter God's rest. But if we maintain our confession in Jesus, then we will enter God's rest. We get a taste of this rest in this life; we see the full fulfillment of it in eternity. The new covenant is a wonderful reality for us Christians. Maintain your confession to enjoy the fullness of it.

On Wednesday evenings, we're still working our way through the Minor Prophets. We've covered Jonah, Amos, and Hosea in their entirety. Now we'll get into Micah. The more I read these Minor Prophets, the more I

see that they fit our times. Similar to Israel, America became a nation in covenant with God during the times of the Puritans. Like Israel, we quickly became prosperous and powerful as a result of obedience to that covenant. Like Israel, we have slowly become an apostate nation with much disobedience to that covenant. Just as Israel and Judah deserved judgment, so also do we. Just as God used disaster to bring them to repentance and obedience, I think the same will happen to us. I believe America will eventually return to covenant faithfulness with God. But I think it'll take disaster to bring us back to that point. We've already had a few hard years. I expect things to get harder in 2024. The night might get very dark, but it'll make the day all the more alorious when it comes. Let's continue to pray for awakening and reformation. Let's continue to labor for awakening and reformation. And let's do what we can to make our homes and our church ever more faithful to God's covenant.

We enjoyed a lot of events over the summer. For August, we plan on having a camping trip at Appalachian Christian Camp. We also plan on having round two of the gun safety training.

This month's book recommendation is Douglas Wilson's Mere Christendom. It's a quick and easy read about a Christian model of politics. As the days get darker due to secularism and apostasy, Wilson's words will prove more prophetic and timely.


