Are there some things that we can do that will help our souls be healthy? The only place to look for that answer is the Bible. When it comes to being healthy spiritually, it takes more than <u>Chicken Soup for the Soul</u>. The country is filled with books on positive thinking, how to improve to be a better you, and at the time of writing this article, there are hundreds more books getting ready to hit the shelves just in time for Christmas gifts. Why is

it that the American experience has grown into high anxiety, loneliness, and depression? All these pitfalls grow during the holiday season of Thanksgiving and Christmas. How can we as God's people avoid the holiday blues? The remedy is as profound as it is simple. Giving thanks lifts the spirit from depres-

sion and sets the course for a life that is content. A life that is thankful and content is a profoundly healthy life! Maybe you're healthy and you didn't know it, or you are spiritually sick, and you are not aware of the danger you are in. Let's do some spiritual inventory. Are you giving thanks or are you prone to complain? Is your life marked by contentment knowing that God is in control of your life, or are you anxious about Are you drifting spiritually, or life in general? are you as Paul says in 1 Corinthians 15:58, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

Staying fit spiritually is strategic. We have to be alert and vigilant. We believe when God saves us, He seals us; that we cannot lose our salvation. But we can become unproductive. As Hebrews 2:1 says, "Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, lest we drift away." Listen to how Alistair Begg uses a simple acronym as a reminder of how to stay spiritually fit: "For the development of a meaningful prayer life falters, not so much because of a lack of zeal as because of a lack of strategy. The simple acronym ACTS may prove to be as helpful as any. A stands for ado-

ration, C for confession, T for thanksgiving, and S for supplication." So, let us be on the alert this Thanksgiving and not only avoid the pitfalls of the holiday blues, but help others who may be facing their first Thanksgiving or Christmas without a loved one, or have suffered a horrible loss. God will shine through His

people in the dark days we live in for His glory. Isaiah says in chapter 60:1-2, "Arise, shine; for your light has come! And the glory of the LORD is risen upon you. For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and deep darkness the people; but the LORD will arise over you, and His glory will be seen upon you." Let's all agree that no matter how positive of a spin we try to put on the world right now, it is dark. It is dark in our country; it is dark in Europe; it is dark in Israel. So, as we move from giving God thanks for His abiding presence in our troubled times, let us remember the hymn says, "Yet in thy dark streets shineth, the everlasting Light, the hopes and fears of all the years, are met in Thee to-

night." Christ is the greatest gift from God the Father to the world, that keeps on giving life to all who come to Him. Stanza 4 says, "O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray, cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels, the great glad tidings tell, O come to us, abide with us, our Lord, Emmanuel." This is how we overcome the darkness of the winter blues. We meditate on His bountiful care, and we know that He is in control. In closing, John MacArthur says, "Those who seek to control their own lives will inevitably be frustrated. A confident trust in God's provi-

dence is foundational to contentment." This is why the Pilgrims were able to gather and give God thanks at the end of a difficult year. Let us push back the darkness with thanksgiving. Let us focus on Christ, the reason for Christmas, and it will be a wonderful season filled with joy.

We're still working on the Christian Life during our Sunday School gatherings. We

completed a mini-series on the spiritual disciplines, and we completed a mini-series on the standards of godliness. Now we're working on a mini-series on Old Testament commands. We covered the creation commands in the early chapters of Genesis. Now we're working on the 10 commandments. If you ever want to see how the institutional church has understood the meaning and application of the 10 commandments in church history, then look into past confessions. We finished our Wednesday night series on the Minor Prophets! We are now shifting into a series on Ezra, and we're getting back to small group discussions on Wednesday nights.

In October, we had a fun time at the church's Trunk-or-Treat! The trunks looked great, and I'm glad to say that we saw both familiar and unfamiliar faces. I hope there were seekers in attendance, and I hope that God brings them back to hear the gospel at our church.

We also had a blast at our city wide scavenger hunt! The winning team got 51 points and found most of the locations! We'll have to do this again next year.

We had a successful Christmas Shoe Box event on November 1st. Another youth group partnered with us, and it looks like we completed over two dozen boxes together! Let's pray the Lord causes the gospel to advance through this ministry.

Lastly, we'll join the children's ministry for Fall Festival activities on November 15th.
