As fast as last year went by, I think we can better understand what James says in chapter 4:13-14, "Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit"; whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away." Life goes by too fast, so let us maximize the time we have this year. I highlighted and underlined let us for a reason. The passages of Scripture found in

the book of Hebrews are admonishing God's people to move forward in Christ. There is no better way to start this new year off than with that mentality and resolve. If you find yourself burdened with the trials of life and overwhelmed, I want to admonish you to hear the Word of the Lord.

What are the possibilities for us as a church if we follow the let us passages.

Someone has said that this is the garden salad (lettuce) messages of Hebrews. As we read these passages, it may prompt you to do a deeper dive into all the chapters and verses. That would be a good thing-to go as far as you can in understanding all the admonishment that God has given for His people. So, let us begin with a simple reading of the text starting with these verses:

Hebrews 4:1, "Therefore, since a promise remains of entering His rest, let us fear lest any of you seem to have come short of it."

Hebrews 4:11, "Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience."

Hebrews 4:14-16, "Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heav-

ens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. 15 For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. 16 Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

Hebrews 6:1, "Therefore, leaving the discussion of the elementary principles of Christ, let us go on to perfection, not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God."

Hebrews 10:22-25, "let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts

sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. 23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, 25 not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the

more as you see the Day approaching."

Hebrews 12:1-3, "Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, 2 looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Hebrews 13:15-16, "Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name. 16 But do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased."

Dear Church Family,

The Calvary Cares Mission Team wanted to give an update on the progress the mission has made during the last year. At this time last year, we had

one freezer and we were serving around 50 people during the Tuesday food give away days. We open the mission at 12:00 on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month. We have served a total of 1296 households from January through November of this year. Not only are people able to obtain much needed food and clothing, but they are also given the Word of God and many people have asked for individual prayer. Someone is always available to give the gospel and pray with people.

We give away food two days a month, serving anywhere from 52 to 94 households on each of those days. Additionally, we have acquired three more freezers; two from Second Harvest and the remaining two from other sources. We hope to acquire a couple more freezers to take care of the bountiful blessings the Lord Jesus Christ has given us. He has blessed the mission beyond anything we could have imagined. We pick up free food from Walmart on Wednesday and Friday mornings and from Food City on Friday mornings. We receive frozen foods, such as meat, bread, pizzas, pastries, frozen vegetables, etc. We also receive, bread, dairy products such as yogurt, milk, juice, etc., and produce. This has filled our freezers/refrigerators to capacity almost every week. The people are very excited to obtain these items that they normally would be unable to purchase. We also receive Christmas food boxes from Food Lion. The boxes contain canned goods, mac and cheese and rice. We had enough boxes last year to last for six months.

When we receive items such as produce, some breads and items that we are unable to keep over to the food giveaway day, we take these items to the women's jail. The lady inmates are so very appreciative of these items which they put to good use.

During the food giveaway days, the Salvation Army attends to help people obtain help with services such as electric bills, or housing. They also help with other needed requests as they are able. We have a pretty large clothes closet consisting of men, women, and children's clothing items. These items are much needed by the people com-

ing to obtain food and we give away many clothes during the food days.

Pastor David and some other people have made home visits to the elderly and other people who may not be able to pick up food for themselves. Additionally, there have been many people call the Church office in dire need of food. Someone from the mission gathers the food bags for these people and takes it to their homes.

It is truly a blessing to be a part of this mission and all of us are in awe at what the Lord has done. We have acquired many partners in this endeavor. I previously named Wal Mart and Food City, but I want to mention others who have contributed. I hope to not leave anyone out, but I want to mention the following businesses who have donated items, money, or time: Calvary Baptist Church, Food Lion, the Post Office, Second Harvest, Farm Bureau, Tsubaki Nakashima (formerly N and N), Ninth Street Baptist Church, Valley Forge Auction, CDJR of Elizabethton. In addition to businesses, we have had many individual people from the Church and community who have made monetary donations.

We are so very thankful for all the food and clothing donated by the people of our Church. Please don't forget about us as we are always in need of food items. Even though we get the free food from businesses, we do not get canned goods so we need your donations. The donations are picked up on Monday morning and taken to the mission each week. Everyone has been very generous and we hope you all will continue to donate.

Please continue to pray for the mission. It is a blessing to serve in this capacity and many people have written thank you notes, and/or verbally thanked us. It is not that we need to be thanked, but it does let us know that people appreciate and need the services. We started out very small and have grown beyond what anyone would have thought. The Lord has blessed our small endeavors and we are here to serve Him, reaching many needy people within our county. We have a wonderful Calvary Cares Mission Team working diligently and cohesively to provide for the needly people of our community.
