truth and the struggle of so few missionaries taking the gospel to the 472 million Chinese in her day. She also shared the urgent need for more workers and for Southern Baptists to support them through prayer and giving. She once wrote home to the Foreign Mission Board, "Please say to the new missionaries they are coming to a life of hardship, responsibility and constant self-denial. Disease, turmoil, and lack of co-workers threatened to undo Lottie's work. But she gave herself completely to God, helping lay the foundation of what would become the modern Chinese church, one of the fastestgrowing Christian movements in the world. Lottie Moon died at 72 — ill and in declining health after decades ministering to her beloved Chinese. But her legacy lives on. Today, when gifts aren't growing as quickly as the number of workers God is calling to the

field, her call for sacrificial giving rings with more urgency than ever."

How we thank God for the life of Lottie Moon who has inspired millions upon millions of people to give and thousands upon thousands of people to go to the ends of the earth and share the Gospel! Lottie died December 24, 1912. She weighed 50 pounds as she gave her food in the time of great famine to feed the people she loved. Let her example of love for God, love for the lost, and the commitment to sacrifice re -inspire all of us to a renewed commitment. Calvary Baptist Church has been, and we pray will continue to be committed to the mission.

"Low in the grave He lay, Jesus my Savior, waiting the coming day, Jesus my Lord." We know

and love this song, especially the next line. But wait What if our most important Christian celebration of the year did not include resurrection? "If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable (1 Corinthians 15:19)." "Thanks be to God, which gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ (v. 57)." Paul tells us in verse 20, "But now is Messiah risen from the dead and become the first fruits of them that slept." Notice the word firstfruits is plural, not singular. Who is this group of "bodies of the saints" (Matthew 27:52) who were harvested from "Abraham's bosom (Luke 16:22)? These raised bodies were visible in Jerusalem. Now notice Matthew 27:53 where scripture says they came out of the graves AFTER His resurrection. It's important to note that Jesus was first. Why? Jesus is the "only begotten" of God that makes all other resurrections possible. Now following this concept of firstfruits, Paul points out in

Romans 11:16, "For if the firstfurit is holy, the lump is also holy; and if the root is holy so are the branches." From scripture we know that the firstfuruits have already been offered and accepted. But the main harvest of primarily gentiles continues. Now as we follow the Old Testament pattern of harvest, when the main harvest is complete, then will come the corners and the gleanings. Paul helps to clarify this consummation of harvest season in 1 Corinthians 15:23 where scripture says, "each one in his own order." Paul speaking of this same timeframe wrote in Romans 11, "what shall the receiving of Israel be, but life from the dead?" All these details clarify a season in Israel's story known as "Jacob's Trouble." Zechariah 13:9 says one third of Jewish people will survive. Daniel 12:10 speaks of "many being purified, made white and refined ... " but I'm concerned about shat precedes this conclusion. Daniel 12:7, "...when the power of the holy people has been completely shattered, all these things shall be finished." Now if the "holy people" is Israel what would best represent their power? Obvious

choices would be their economy or their military and most likely their democracy. The rest of the story reveals that neither of these three things will be necessary for Israel's future. Jesus alone will provide these things. Just like the dayhs of Noah and Lot, this time through judgment one third of the Jewish people will endure to the end and
