


Our Living Hope

"I-zai-ah." Does anybody remember a certain South African preacherman who pronounced Isaiah so distinctly? Isaiah was John Kuhne's book of choice, teaching at both YWAM conferences in Kenya and Ukraine. I thank God for the opportunity to get a taste of taking the scriptures to another culture. Wonderful, enlightening, vivid memories are mine forever as our life stories (John & Curtis) intertwined according to God's plan. HE is amazing!

John's teaching on Isaiah caught my attention then and has led me to focus on Isaiah now, primarily chapter 61. Starting verse one we find the Trinity of God expressed in the pronouns. Next, we understand the title "LORD" to be written in all capital letters means that "Yahweh" is anointing His Messiah. That messiah will preach Good News to the humble. Through miracles and healings He will lift up the face of those who are down trodden giving new hope. "Preaching liberty to captives" and "the opening of the prison to them that are bound" can be interpreted as Messiah offering salvation by grace through faith and also Paul's teaching in Ephesians 4:8-10 and Psalms 68:18 where Messiah will take ownership of all souls in Abraham's bosom.

And than comes verse 2. Jesus reads the first line of verse two in the synagogue in Nazareth and stops. He hands the scroll back, sits down, in Luke 4:21 he said, "This day is this scripture fulfilled in your ears." By choosing not to read the rest of the verse, He was leaving out the day of vengeance. This is one of those verses in scripture where rightly dividing the Word is necessary. Compressed in verse two we perceive the first and the second coming of Messiah. The year of God's favor Is when God became man to provide a way for believers to become acceptable in God's holy presence. The day of vengeance is known as "Jacob's Trouble." A time when God pours out His wrath on Israel and the Kingdom of anti-Christ. Over 2,000 years has Messiah been patiently speaking favor and not

wrath. When trouble comes Israel will experience fiery trials for 3 1/2 years, then verse three God will give them beauty for ashes at His Second Coming.
