In the book of "first things," did God create "a Man" or "a Marriage?" FYI, In the book of the revealing of the Messi-

ah, we are told of a marriage. The joining of a Bride and a Groom in a Holy, Hesed Covenant. The bond is so complete that the two become one. Genesis 2:24 says the "two shall become one flesh." This is a great mystery that is symbolic of Christ and the Church.

Another mystery is found in Genesis 5:2, "male and female created he them; blessed them and called their name Adam." Scripture doesn't address Eve separate from Adam. The reason it reads this way is obvious, they were both in Adam. So, HE created them...then, HE named them one name. I see this as a picture of our future reality (John 14:3). God started giving us a word-picture of our destiny in the first chapter of our Bible.

He said, "God created man in His own image; in the image of God created he him; Male and female created he them (Genesis1:27)". What does the "image of God" mean? The image is something eternal. Also, the image is invisible. Scripture says, in the Hebrew language, God took the "Tslea" or side chamber out of Adam and

with it He made a woman. The verb "made" is not the same verb (in Hebrew) as the verb in Genesis 1:1. God took something physical out of Adam and then fashioned a body in which He placed an eternal, invisible living soul. The mind, the will, the emotions are the image of God placed in both Adam and Eve.

Adam declared this creature God presented to him as bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh: she shall be woman because she was taken out of man. The foreshadowing intentionality of the first "living soul" mentioning flesh and bone linesup perfectly with Jesus in Luke 24:39b, "a spirit hath not flesh and bone as ye see me have." Paul presents this same idea in Ephesians 5, The church is the wife Jesus loves and dies for. In Ephesians 5:23, Paul writes, "He is the savior of the body." The body in marriage includes the wife. Therefore, Jesus is the savior of the soul and the body as well. The Scripture never tells the wife to love her husband -- Why? She is one flesh with him. Some day when the flesh and bone body is united with the soul and spirit, we believers will join together to be in the body of Messiah. What a future! To be joint heirs with Christ.
